


We've built strong bonds with our community, the shelters, and animal carers; together, we're making a real impact in the wildlife sector right across Victoria.

EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR ANIMALS:

OUR WILDLIFE RESCUE SERVICE

Our wildlife rescue service means we're here 24/7 to help sick, injured, orphaned or abandoned animals in need. Depending on their needs, they're taken to vets, shelters, carers, zoos, and sanctuaries. We receive 1000s of calls each year, and we're committed to responding to every single call and getting rescuers out, as quickly as possible.

With the help of our sponsor, OracleCMS (a customer management solutions company), giving us a lifelong donation of a 1300 number and 24-hour call service means we can be there for wildlife any hour of the day or night. They answer all the calls and transfer them to our Rescue Phone Operators. This helped tremendously, enabling us to have multiple rostered phone operators for rescue and advice at any one time.


With OracleCMS, our team of Rescue Phone Operators are highly responsive and efficient.

They handle all sorts of calls; advise on setting up rescues, and work closely with other organisations, shelters and carers to ensure every animal gets help. Since our partnership started with OracleCMS, we've taken over 6000 calls this financial year, and we appreciate the incredible amount of time and support they've donated to us.

So we can give the best care, we've created an extensive training manual, directory and mapping platform for handling all calls and have streamlined our data handling.

Without the help of the wonderful members of the public who find injured and orphaned wildlife and call us for help, we wouldn't be able to save lives and help end the suffering of native animals in need.

Check out the incredible network of vets, shelters, and carers we collaborate with across Melbourne and Victoria.










We use our new system to log and categorise all our rescue calls by species and locations.


This allows the team to prepare for peak rescue times during seasonal fluctuations, such as fledgling season when baby birds often need assistance when found on the ground.


We've found social media and our website are powerful tools to get our message across. Our volunteers help the public understand how to help wildlife in need by sharing educational posts.

As the pie chart shows, Warriors 4 Wildlife receives calls for a variety of species, including macropods, birds, reptiles, possums, wombats and echidnas, and non-native species and domestic pets.

The map is a monthly report of rescue calls received in Melbourne alone.

IT'S FEEL GOOD STORY TIME

The young Tawny Frogmouth you see in the pictures was found by a family in their backyard.

It had fallen out of its nest and was in danger on the ground.

We quickly sprang into action and reached out to the folks at Boobook Wildlife Shelter.

She rushed over and helped the family create a cosy, makeshift nest using an ice cream container filled with soft, snuggly nesting material.

They placed the nest high up in the tree to keep the Tawny safe from any hungry predators as it continue to grow.

Not all animals need medical attention – sometimes, we just need to give them a helping hand or reunite them back to their parents.

Working together is the key to giving these animals a second chance at life!











WE OPENED THE FIRST WILDLIFE SUPPORT CENTRE IN VICTORIA

We did it!

In August 2021, Warriors 4 Wildlife leased a warehouse in the South-Eastern suburbs of Melbourne to serve as the first-ever wildlife supply and donation centre in Victoria.

It holds all our volunteer rescue equipment that we use for our Rescue and Transport workshops, these include rescue baskets, cleaning products, T-shirts, and high visibility vests.

When members of our team and wildlife community collect supplies, many stories and ideas are shared in a collaborative and safe environment.

It's essential our wildlife shelters continue to rehabilitate wildlife for years to come, that they're prepared for the busy summer periods and have a central location for donations in times of natural disaster.

Even though it's only been open only for a short period of time, we're already seeing the benefits and impact it's having on the broader wildlife community, giving them strength and hope in times of need.

This is our biggest project to date and is proving an invaluable asset to the wildlife community.

SUPPORT 4 SHELTERS: TOGETHER WE ARE STRONGER

At Warriors 4 Wildlife, we've been supporting shelters since our inception. It's an integral part of why our organisation was founded. Shelters and carers are the unsung heroes who deserve support for all their tremendous efforts, taking in wildlife on a daily basis.

Running a shelter can be expensive, and it's often self-funded. That's why our Support 4 Shelters Program is so important. We understand how time-consuming applying for grants and fundraising can be, and we want to help ease the financial burden so that shelters can focus on what they do best: rehabilitating native wildlife.

We make it easy for shelters to request support. They simply fill out an online request form on our website. We prioritise the needs of shelters and carers and honour their requests as soon as possible. Thanks to our support, shelters can treat more wildlife, have better facilities that increase an animal's chance of survival, and release more animals back into their natural habitats, which ultimately improves Victoria's biodiversity.

This year alone, we've donated over \$67,708 to 100+ wildlife shelters and foster carers in Victoria. This includes a variety of formulas, food, aviaries, incubators, and equipment. We've also been able to provide much-needed supplies like medical supplies, pouches, laundry detergents and nesting boxes – all thanks to the generosity of the public.

With our special ties to wildlife shelters and carers, we're always striving to create a strong community. It's important to meet others in the industry, share ideas, and tackle challenges together. This helps improve everyone's well-being and helps create a more united and healthy wildlife community.

W4W went on an extensive donation run to Gippsland. We distributed essential supplies for shelters, including food, medical, and incubators, to help them reduce their costs. Our team had a wonderful time visiting carers and foster carers in Sale, Metung and Omeo, and were amazed by the incredible distances they cover for wildlife rescues.

Warriors 4 Wildlife is an essential link in the chain of survival for my rescues as I'm isolated in my area. They play an integral role in the ongoing commitment I have toward wildlife care."

WHEN DISASTER STRIKES... WE PROVIDE RELIEF

Warriors 4 Wildlife played an important role by providing crucial emergency relief supplies to shelters in need during times of crisis. This included supporting shelters taking in injured and burnt wildlife, and getting hay and livestock feed to farms, and to the surrounding communities for their domestic animals. To date, W4W has distributed over 800 hundred tons of supplies to those affected by the devastating fires in Victoria through its network of volunteers.

As a proactive organisation, W4W is prepared for busy summer seasons and emergency situations that may arise in the future. We remain committed to playing a vital role in responding to natural disasters that continue to threaten the country, our land, and our wildlife.

In response to the recent flooding events in NSW and Queensland, W4W quickly assembled a large package of goods and sent it to a vet clinic in Queensland. This was much-needed medical equipment not only for wildlife but for people's pets.

Additionally, two hardworking people delivered a trailer full of donated supplies and assisted with repairs and clean-up in the lower flood areas in NSW. This was a great opportunity for W4W to support our neighbouring states in such a challenging time and demonstrate the power of the wildlife community working and networking together.











WILDLIFE EDUCATION AND WORKSHOPS

At Warriors 4 Wildlife, we love to get the community involved in what we do. That's why we offer a variety of educational workshops and activities for wildlife enthusiasts. From rescue and transport to educational events, there's something for everyone.

Our workshops are led by experienced rescuers who have the skills and knowledge to help prepare volunteers and the public to safely rescue and transport injured or orphaned wildlife. Our sessions cover: safety, identification, capture, and the handling and transporting of native animals.

We hold workshops 4-5 times throughout the year to recruit new volunteers.

Whether you're a seasoned rescuer or just starting out, these workshops are a valuable tool in getting you ready for the busy seasons.

We also host specialised workshops in collaboration with experienced wildlife organisations and shelters to further advance the knowledge and skills of our rescue volunteers.

Due to the covid 19 lockdowns, we redeveloped our Basic Wildlife Rescue and Transport Workshop so we could host it online. It means we can now successfully deliver multiple workshops throughout the year. Our online workshops have extended our ability to engage more rescue volunteers throughout Melbourne and from regional Victoria.

Education plays a vital role in the rescue and conservation of wildlife. We educate through our workshops, website, and social media posts.

One of our popular community events is Possum Box Workshop, where you can learn more about the native wildlife living in your backyard and how to co-exist with them. We make possum boxes to donate to shelters so that orphaned joeys have a cosy home to stay in while they're in care. When they're ready to be released back into the wild, the shelter attached the box to a tree, so the possums can get used to their new environment all while being safe and secure in familiar surroundings.



SCHOOL TALKS

At W4W we love sharing our knowledge and passion for wildlife with others. We'll go to schools, scouts, and community groups to spread the word about what we do and why rescuing wildlife is so important. We're big on educating kids about conservation, how to protect our natural spaces, and how to make their own backyard a haven for native animals. The people we visit are always engaged and keen to learn.
